NEW CLASS: 4th period, 12:40-1:30pm – Wool Art: Needle Felting, ages 10+. Students will learn how to create works of art with wool by using needles and wet felting. Students will learn through the process of changing raw wool into something useful, wash and dye raw wool in some classes. Students will be able to create dryer balls that aid in softening and speeding up the drying process of clothes. Another project will be creating animals from wool. Students need to be responsible and able to use crafting needles. The needles are sharp. Each kit comes with a finger guard but the students still need to handle needles with care.

NEW CLASS: 4th period, 12:40-1:30pm – Effective Communication, ages 15+

1st period, 9:10-10:00, Lit. Study: *The Door in the Wall*, by Marguerite de Angeli, must be unabridged, ages 9-13, new students welcome as space allows. Students must be independent readers and able to write coherent sentences. Progeny Press is a literature study guide from a Biblical perspective. The setting is in England some time between 1360-1460. Themes are knighthood plague, patience, separation, monastery life, gratefulness, castles, contentment, overcoming physical limitation, and courage.

Class details: Students will complete the study guide independently and bring it to class to share and discuss. Additional activities will be as time allow. A syllabus listing reading chapters and study guide questions to be completed each week will be provided to each student.

2nd period, 10:10-11:00, Early American History, ages 6-10 yrs., new students welcome as space allows. This continues Early American History Through Literature study which will take students through the first Indigenous people of the Americas, the Vikings' discovery of America, the exploration, colonization, settlement, and establishment of the United States. 2nd period, 10:10-11:00, Swimming Creatures, ages 7-12 yrs., new students welcome as space allows but will have missed introductory content. Students will dive into zoology and age-appropriate apologetics with Apologia's Swimming Creatures course. First quarter students created a model aquarium diorama and will complete several hands-on experiments. Students are expected to have a copy of the text at home and must keep up with the reading schedule. Class time will be devoted to review, discussion, experiments, and projects. This class is for students ages 7-12 who can independently write complete sentences. This is the second book in a zoology series (land animals, swimming creatures, flying creatures) but can be used as a stand-alone book or out of order. Themes are adventure, treasure, discernment, duplicity, and overcoming. The book could contain cursing, death, intense fighting, and drinking. **Parents are to do due diligence in previewing the materials.**
